Start date for submissions: February 1st, 2023.

Last day for submissions: February 22nd, 2023.

Purpose: to provide educational resources to youth, encourage youth to practice their educational skills, and raise awareness of people of colour issues.

First and second prize includes: a laptop and a \$25 bookstore gift card.

Topics:

- Your experience as a youth of colour.
- How a historical person of colour has inspired you.
- Other stories on local and personal heritage and identity.

Types of submissions:

- Written piece - essay, story, or poem.
- Creative art piece.
- Recording – audio and/or visual.

Length: ideally between a paragraph (20 secs) and five pages (30 mins).

Eligibility:

- Ages 12 to 18
- Living in the Wellington County area - Fergus, Elora, Drayton, Arthur, Mount Forest, Palmerston, etc., but **not Guelph**.
- In need of educational supplies an asset.
- Challenge yourself! We encourage youth with all abilities to make a submission as we are not judging the submission based on perfect grammar, spelling, or performance. If the piece took a special level of effort, tell us about it in the submission form.
